

Local Sydney Artist, Nikki Adams, paints predominately with oils; her love of colour and contrast is clear with her often exaggerated, yet at times subdued palette. She uses bold brush strokes to block in shapes and colours to describe form.

Nikki's still life works are sourced from around her own home surroundings; the naturally accumulated artefacts of living amongst children, cooking utensils, school memorabilia, light sabres, and everyday life graced by a vase of glorious flowers that, like Margaret Olley's fresh cut flowers, whither as Nikki works capturing their life.

Nikki Adams is also very drawn toward landscape painting capturing the silence of Sydney's waterways and locales.
